

he research is clear! We, and our community, become happier and healthier after volunteering.

The Fairfield Police Activities League (PAL) has been active in Fairfield since the 1970s! In 2009, after a needs assessment, the board of directors honed their focus to teens and together with the city of Fairfield and others, opened the Matt Garcia Youth Center. That is when things

really took off. Since then, PAL has served more than 4,000 local teens and their families. Fairfield PAL uses recreation to engage underserved teens and build great qualities.

PAL's fun and games become a consistent lab for members to test out new ways to make friends, solve problems, and think about their future. The PAL Center is open from 3 to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 3 to 10:30 p.m. Friday. Memberships are entirely free! Membership is open to any Fairfield, Suisun City or Travis teen ages 13-18 who is enrolled in school.

The center hosts a calendar of both traditional and nontraditional recreational activities like basketball. boxing, roller-skating, martial arts, dance, arts and crafts, contests, chess, laser tag, bubble soccer, archery tag,

cooking classes and video games. The center has an active Career Café program that offers a variety of workshops and classes – including the annual Business Etiquette Challenge Gauntlet, internships, the Money Game, Clifton Strengths Based Leadership, and entrepreneurial and personal branding programs. Members can find a quiet place to finish school projects and homework at the Homework Zone – and participate in GPA

boot camps to improve their study skills, explore critical thinking strategies and learn test-taking practices.

While staff and volunteers weave the Alive & Free violence prevention framework throughout all of the center's programs, members can also attend stress management workshops, develop an Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) toolbox, participate in Service Learning, join the Girls Circle (made possible with support from the Soroptimist International of Central Solano County) or Boys Council structured support groups, tap into their creativity to help them lean into their social and emotional skills at Chill & Spill art classes, improve their communication skills at a Community Circle, develop their leadership and civic deftness while serving on the PAL Student Council, prepare for life after high school at

On average, PAL members stay at the center for almost 3 hours during each visit, often enjoying a delicious meals provided by members of the Fairfield Clergy Action Network (CAN), the Matt Garcia Foundation and local Rotarians.

This fall, we will re-open at our new location on 2256 N. Texas St. and we can't wait to bring our positive energy and roller-skating back to the area. We are looking forward to working closely with businesses in the area, as well.

Volunteers and partners will play a critical role when we re-open.

Volunteers not only enhance programs, but they are critical role models that show teens how to socialize and deal with social situations. PAL volunteers make a real difference. PAL volunteers do a lot of good.

It doesn't stop there. Volunteering is also good for you! In fact, research shows that adults who volunteer 100 hours or more in a year are some of the healthiest people in the United States! Since studies indicate that community service improves the elasticity in the brain, volunteering also reduces our risk of developing dementia. People who volunteer on a regular basis are less likely to develop high blood pressure and report greater mental health outcomes. Volunteering is a fun and easy way to get your daily steps in, connect with new people, and even learn new things!

Volunteering improves lives – both the lives of the people we help and our own!

At PAL, you can volunteer to referee basketball games, keep score or create a special vibe as an announcer! Share your love of card playing by volunteering to be a poker dealer! 


Logistic centers will create jobs

olano County, and the Fairfield-Suisun area, continues to emerge as a regional center for logistics building off an experienced workforce, cost competitiveness and excellent transportation infrastructure with connections to the Bay Area, Sacramento and the Central Valley. Fairfield and Suisun City have experienced the highest

growth in Solano County for industrial absorption from 2015 to 2020 with 73% of all absorption in Solano County occurring in Fairfield-Suisun. To give perspective, Solano County, as a whole, hosts approximately 24,775 jobs in manufacturing, wholesale and transportation with 8,885 of these jobs being located in Fairfield and Suisun City.

Building off the sustained growth and strong market demand for logistics facilities in the Fairfield-Suisun area, Buzz Oates, a leading commercial developer in Northern California, has proposed two logistics centers that are



2.1 million square feet in addition to 47 acres of permanently preserved open space.

These two projects are projected to create more than 4,500 jobs in Suisun City and Solano County, generating more than \$300 million in annual wages and compensation and more than \$900 million in total economic activity at buildout. This is a significant stimulus to the economies of Suisun City, Fairfield and Solano County, creating numerous new employment opportunities and spurring significant private investment in the area.

To put that in perspective, Suisun City currently has more than 29,000 residents and only approximately 4,000 jobs. This is a significant jobs-housing imbalance which will be improved as these projects are built out and occupied. By locating jobs close to where people live, commutes can be shortened, which will allow people to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions from driving and spend less time getting to and from their jobs. These employment opportunities provide a ladder to prosperity and help create strong communities. The businesses that will locate here will stimulate local economies by creating almost \$1 million in net surplus tax revenues to Suisun City to support important services like police, fire, road maintenance and other city services, bringing new customers to local businesses, increasing local philanthropy and civil society, and creating a stronger job market for local residents and employers.

As we have all probably become acutely aware in recent years, strong supply chains are vital to our economy. These projects are important investments that will strengthen supply chains with benefits for Solano County. California and the world. Logistics centers like the two proposed by Buzz Oates help reduce costs and save time not only for businesses, but, ultimately, for consumers.

Importantly, these projects also help address the need for sustainable development in Solano County. Not only do

NorthBay adopts a fresh brand

hanging your brand is never easy, but try doing it after 35 years of continuity in a community that knows and recognizes you at a glance.

But that was one of the reasons NorthBay Healthcare saw the need for change. After all, the system has evolved greatly since 1987, and it was time for a fresh look and a new name.

Meet NorthBay Health, still delivering compassionate care and advanced medicine, close to home, but with a fresh look and feel, a new symbol and new colors designed to better reflect the organization's fastgrowing, cutting-edge health care offerings.

"Intercommunity Hospital in Fairfield transitioned into NorthBay Healthcare in 1987, when NorthBay VacaValley Hospital was born," explained President and CEO B. Konard Jones. "Our organization has changed tremendously in the past 35 years. We've added cardiovascular surgery, neuroscience and neurosurgery and a Level II Trauma Center. We're Magnet-designated for excellence in nursing. We're a Mayo Clinic Care Network member. We offer robotic surgery. The list goes on and on. We continue to raise the bar by offering innovative medical services right here in Solano County, which our new brand celebrates."

Jones made the announcement to staff and physicians in Zoom presentations on Thursday, June 2, noting that it has been several years in the making, and that it will take several years to roll out across the organization's health care landscape.

"Giving birth to a new brand during a two-year-plus pandemic had its own unique challenges, but we're proud of our new brand," said Jones. "It reflects our unique contribution to the health care landscape. It exemplifies our determination to remain an independent health care system, our position as a leader in advanced medicine and our undying commitment to caring for this community in ways that instill confidence and provide comfort and convenience for patients."

The symbol is the shape of a forward-leaning letter N that is actually composed of two hearts, similar to the organization's previous symbol, which featured two intertwined hearts. The new colors reflect the region's color pallet, from the rolling hills to the bay.

"A brand is more than a logo, it's a symbol of our organization, and our promise of top-notch care, when you need it and where you need it," Jones said.

The organization began as Intercommunity Hospital in Fairfield in 1960, after four years of fundraising efforts by

local residents. It was clear from the very beginning that providing local health care was needed to keep pace with the growing region, according to Jones.

In 1987, the organization changed its name to NorthBay Healthcare and opened the doors to NorthBay VacaValley Hospital, a 50-bed facility.

In addition to the two hospitals, the system now has numerous specialty care practices, including the NorthBay Cancer Center and the Center for Orthopedics, three primary care centers, two Urgent Care Centers (with another opening soon in American Canyon and yet another to open in Dixon this summer). It employs 2,500 people in its medical clinics, hospitals and administration offices.



they help ameliorate Suisun City's jobs-housing imbalance and potentially reduce commutes, but they will be net zero energy facilities using no natural gas, they will install infrastructure for advanced EV charging and plug-ins for electric trucks to ensure we are building responsibly toward a more sustainable future.

The Highway 12 Logistics Center and the Suisun Logistics Center just conducted a well-attended public meeting as part of the Suisun City's Good Neighbor Policy, which was an opportunity for residents to ask questions and share their views on these projects. They will now move forward to the Suisun City Planning Commission, and, hopefully, to the City Council for consideration of approval.
